August 2014

The highlight of the last few months was a busy but enjoyable time at the National Fieldays. This year we were part of the new breeds arena area. This was an idea to get more animals on display at the Fieldays.

A marque, yards and sound system were supplied for us and three other breeds (two cattle and alpacas). This saved us a lot of work in setting up and packing up. We were expected to do a demonstration twice a day. I had great help from Eric and Susan and Faye and Peter, providing stock and being their early each morning and on the site all day. Also thanks to Barry McAlley for taking up the mic twice a day and giving a very informative talk on what to look for in good beef cattle and the points a judge would look for in the show ring.

We had 4 weaner heifers (2 belties, 1 black and 1 white) and Harry J, my 3

They all behaved very well with many people coming up to give them a pat, lots of photos were taken of the non farming types holding Harry's lead rope.

On Saturday morning Te Radar came to visit, spending about an hour with us and leading one of the heifers while Barry was talking, and then had his say telling the people how great Galloway cattle are. Many thanks once again to all that helped and members from further away who called in and spent time on the stand.

Thanks very much to Bridget for getting ear tags and ADLs out to everyone, you should have sent the ADLs back to her by now so if they are still sitting around on the desk please get them corrected and back to Bridget.

From the Registrar, July 2014

Well done

to all that have sent in your

calf returns for registration of your 2013 born calves. There are still a few breeders out there that have yet to do this and before we know it, we'll be into 2014 registrations.

I am happy that the few changes that were made to the form did not confuse anyone too greatly. I have yet to tally up the totals registered to each breed due to still waiting for the last of the forms to be returned.

You should have had your ADL (Active Dam List) forms sent out to you, if you have not please do contact me. This form has only females that are of two years and older, also known as active dams. If you have animals that are not on your list, please add these below the others. Once I have received a percentage of these, I will begin sending out the bill invoice, therefore when you send the ADL back to me, do not send any money.

This is one of the Societies most important forms for you to fill in, it is a means of a "breed audit" and also allows the society to bill you for only the animals that you own. If this is not returned you will be billed for every active female listed on your form.

What a busy month, there has been numerous inquires regarding where to buy both pure and cross bred cattle, as well as enquiries on the requirements of becoming a breeder.

PBB have had a few emails requesting a log in password from some breeders as they wanted to view their herd on line. You do not need this.

- 1# On website home page bottom left, click onto animal enquiry
- 2# Where it has current owner identifier, type in your herd number, that is the 2 or 3 numbers with either B,W or G, pending on what breed you have. Click search, all animals you own will be there in front of you. You can also look up other breeders animals by typing in their herd number.

If you are after a certain animal but do not know its full name...

Eg. Lifestyle Eden. You can put in the name search box % Eden (% Replaces any information you are unsure of) If the stud name is replaced by % then you will end up with all animals with Eden in their name, % can also be used if you are unsure on spelling Life% Eden.

When searching you do not have to fill in all fields, just the name or the animal Identifier (herd book number) is enough. The web site is their for you to enjoy.



Breeder Profile Riverview White Galloway's Sarah Pinfold



opportunity of purchasing some stock from the "Lifestyle Stud" came up I knew this was my chance to start a new hobby!

I am a born & breed farm girl! Growing up on a dairy farm at Woodville, I spent a lot of my time as a child out with Dad on the farm. As I got older I had pet calves for School pet days and once I was old enough to reach, I helped milk. After leaving school I ended up working in retail for many years, and then moved into Call Centre work, but I always enjoyed returning to the farm to help out on my weekends.

For the past 7 years I have been Lower Order Sharemilking on a family farm at Mangatainoka in Northern Wairarapa, milking 240 Frisian & Frisian X cows. The farm is generally flat but there are some gully and creek areas that we don't graze with the dairy stock, this is where the Galloway's come in handy. During the winter & if it's a dry summer, their fed is limited but they don't seem to loose any condition! Actually I don't think you can have a skinny Galloway.

Riverview White Galloway Stud was formed in 2008 after I purchased 3 yearling Heifers & a R2 Bull from Mike & Lorraine Clifford. Originally I was only planning on purchasing the 3 heifers but on the way home from viewing them, it suddenly dawned on me that I would need a bull if I was going to breed from these girls! So after a phone call that evening to Lorraine, I also added "Lifestyle David" to my delivery.

My Galloway herd now consists of 6 breeding cows, 2 of these are still my original girls & the dams of the other 4. In 2011, I purchased Suncrest Arctic Flynn, and then I added Alclutha Evan in 2013. Last year's



calving produced 4 heifers and 2 bulls sired by Suncrest Arctic Flynn. So finally I have reached a point that I can sell some progeny and hopefully get a small return on my original investment. Animals available for sale are listed in the stock sale section of this issue.

My decision to purchase a bull turned out to be a good one as we tried using "David" over the Dairy cows the first year he was here, and had good results with easy calving from the cows. So since then I have used a young Galloway Bull



over the heifers and the older bull over the cows. The demand for the Friesian/Galloway X calves at the local feeder calf sales has been great, so to get an easy calving calf and one that sells for a good price from a heifer is a bonus.

As for the future of "Riverview White Galloway Stud" well as I do get reminded from time to time " this is a Dairy farm Sarah not a beef farm" I guess my herd will have to stay to around 6-8 breeding cows, with the aim of breeding good bloodlines that can be sold to other keen breeders.

FBNZ HOOF & HOOK EVENT

The FBNZ would like to extend an invitation to all breeders to consider to enter steers in the Hoof and Hook event next year. We are also planning a heifer show next year which will be held on the Sunday evening. The details regarding the heifers are:-

Heifer must be born after 1st June 2014

- Under 12's may bring a heifer only
- Over 12's must bring a steer to be eligible to bring a heifer
- Under 12's can use heifer in handling class but over 12's must use steer
- Heifer judging will be after the Handling class on Sunday and the two classes will be pure bred heifer and cross bred heifer
- Pure Bred heifers can go home or may be eligible to enter in the Queen of Hearts (which must be organised prior to event)
- Cross bred heifers are accepted but will be taken home





Red Pointed White Galloways Breeder ~ Tracy Wood

Chelsea Winter's Tripple Chocolate Brownie


Ingredients

100g butter
1 cup sugar
2 free-range eggs
1 tsp pure vanilla essence
³/₄ cup plain flour
1 tsp baking powder
¹/₂ cup good-quality cocoa
100g good-quality white chocolate, cut into small chunks
(Chelsea uses Whittaker's)
100g good-quality dark chocolate, cut into small chunks
(Whittaker's)
Icing sugar to dust (optional)
Whipped cream and berries to serve (optional)

Method

Preheat the oven to 180c conventional. Grease a slice tin, and line the base with baking paper.

Melt the butter in a saucepan over a medium heat. Remove from the heat, and whisk in the sugar. Add the eggs and vanilla essence, and whisk to combine. Sift the flour, baking powder and cocoa into the mixture, add the white




and dark chocolate chunks, and very gently fold with a wooden spoon or spatula until just combined. Don't over mix or the brownie will toughen. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin.

Bake in the oven for about 15-20 minutes then test with a skewer. These brownies are done if the skewer still has a little of the mixture clinging to it. Remove from the oven and cool in the tin before slicing. Store in an airtight container for a week.



Breeder Profile Abergeldie White Galloways Gus and Anita Smith

Anita and I joined the Galloay Club in 2010 with 3 White Galloway's, Lifestyle FiFi, Fancy and Hero, purchased from Lifestyle Galloway's Levin.

Fifi and Fancy both calved with perfectly marked calves, and we ran some Angus cross heifers with Hero also.



Their calves were either well marked White Galloways or completely black. The first few born, the heifers were white and the bulls were black. I thought it could be like red Shaver poultry and colour sexed. But further into the calving this pattern did not continue, however, it came out about 70% of the bulls, now steers, are black.



(This a view from the top of the hill lime rock at the back of the farm)

We farm 300 acre's near Waipukurau, of rolling country with a very steep lime stone hill at the rear boundary. The Galloway's handle the steep parts very well, going up to the top and staying there for days, only coming down for water.

We had a 3 day snow storm in 2011, and day 2, the wind came up and the snow had turned to ice. The wind blew the ice around like a blizzard, the sheep and other cattle stayed close to the shelter of the pine plantations, however, the Galloway's stood out on the grassy knobs never stopped eating and gave us the look of, 'is this the best you have got' ...we can handle a lot worse weather than this! They were amazing, the snow and cold wind just did not bother them, likewise, the hot sunny droughts we get in the summer don't faze them either.



We now have over 100, half and three quarter White Galloway's, and have sent away half bred bulls that at 30 months, all went over 350Kgs, with the best 439Kg. So over all, we are very pleased with the Galloway's very hardy, handle all conditions and grow out to very good weight traits, and for me, the best bit is really small calves. I have not assisted a cow or heifer giving birth when in calf to our herd bull Hero.

Just need to convince dairy farmers to use White Galloway's over their heifers, as the calves are same size as Jersey, just shorter legs, which I believe helps the calving process.
